- I. Call to order
- II. Roll Call
 - a. Present: President Tolman, Vice President Shutty, Senator Smith, Senator McNowelly, Senator Cruz, Senator Thornton, Advisor Sorenson, Advisor Fiedler, Advisor Boughton
 - b. Absent: Senator Burrell
- III. Guests
 - a. President Dr. Schaffer
 - i. He and his family shared biographical information about himself.
 - ii. He would like to plant a seed about student fees
 1. He explained mandatory fees purpose/department.
 2. Student Fees are for student activities.
 - a. Wellness Fees, Intermural Sports Fees, Health Education, Fitness Fee, Wellness Fee, Laramie CC Fees.
 - b. Facilities Fees for both campuses (Cheyenne and Laramie)
 - c. Athletic Fee, Technology Infrastructure Fee, Student Technology Fee
 - iii. President Schaffer would like to see lower fund balances.
 1. There is a need for and students want a RAC.
 2. High fund balances can have implications that we are charging unnecessary fees.
 - iv. He worries about the fund balance growing too much and gave the following comments for Student Government to consider:
 1. Why charge the students if it isn't going to be used by the students paying the fee.
 2. He would like to see the fee structure modified
 3. Most of the fee funds go to student Clubs.
 - a. How would you reach a wider swath of the student body?
 - b. Give serious thought to the student fees and how to restructure.
 - b. President Tolman asked for clarification of the fund balance used for the RAC.
 - c. Senator McNowelly asked if the 800,000 has already been pulled for the RAC. Yes

- d. President Schaffer recommends 10% in savings and spend the rest or adjust the rest of student fees.
- e. President Schaffer recommends that SGA talk to Dr. Miller and Budget Director Ziegler about better allocating and understanding SGA funds and student fees.
- f. President Schaffer would like to apologize to the students. This year he did not put out a memo concerning the Student Open Forum.
 - i. He knows there are questions about the Education Program. Please invite VPAA, Dean of A&H/M&S and Program Director of HR to the next meeting for an update on the issue that came up at the last open forum.
 - 1. Vice President Shutty gave positive feedback concerning action on other issues discussed from the open forum, but acknowledged many students are still wondering if anything was done with the education program.
